

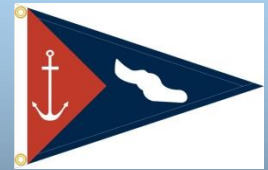

EDUCATION UPDATE

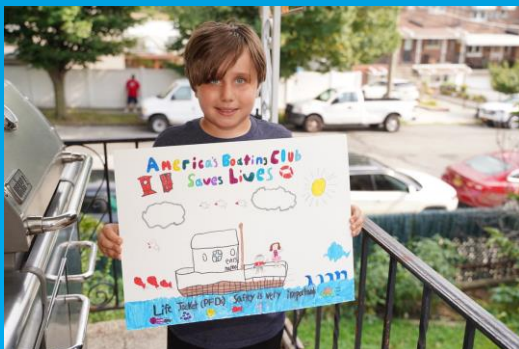

All boaters on recreational watercraft less than 21 feet in length (including motorboats, canoes, kayaks, rowboats and sailboats) must wear a personal flotation device (PFD) from November 1st to May 1st New York waters.

After extensive trouble shooting and several "oh fudges", we decided to look at our fuel gauge and discovered we were out of gas! How embarrassing for the Commander and Educational Officer of our squadron to be out of G-A-S. We are both Senior Navigators (a/k/a "Stupid Navigators") and should have known better.

Fortunately, we have Boat US tow insurance and could reach out to our friend and Bronx Power Squadron member Danny to help us out of this jam. Of course, I left my cell phone home and had to reach out to fellow squadron member Dennis for Danny's cell number. I was sure that after our call, word about our predicament had spread like wild fire and regularly scheduled programming was interrupted to broadcast our debacle. I had to hail Danny on the VHF. I requested a tow and, right on the radio, I admitted we were out of gas! Oh boy. Well, Danny came to the rescue and saved the day. He did tell us with a chuckle he knew of some places we could take some boating education courses. I suppose we deserved the ribbing. Danny instructed us on how to restart our EFI engine after the gas was added. Right after we got the gas, our new engine started up just fine! So, what went wrong? We didn't look at our fuel gauge! All these years, this has never happened before in either our boat or our car. Yes, we should have known better and a good lesson was learned.

Over the years, we have enjoyed lively kidding with our buddy Jeff, a sailor, who seems to run out of gas at every squadron event. So now the laughs are on us! What do you take from this?

LOOK AT YOUR FUEL GAUGE! Something simple and silly can happen to the best of us!

Use the old rule of thumb: One-third of the fuel in your tank to get there, one-third to get back and save the last third as an emergency backup. Oh, and one more thing: look at your fuel gauge before you leave dock not when you're stopped dead in open water.
